SUBJECT: Water Conservation

DATE: 6-25-07

Due to the continued drought conditions and the fact our well is approaching the trigger point for the first level of conservation, we have changed the demand management stage from “0” to “1”. Stage 1 calls for voluntary conservation with a goal of saving 5% of normal use.

Our water supply does not appear to be in any jeopardy at this time. Our tank is nearly full at 22.4 feet out of 24 feet. The history of static water levels at the well, as of June 1st of each year, was 239’ in ’03, 233’ in ’04, 195’ in ’05, 215’ in ’06, and 246’ in ’07. Our trigger point for going to Stage 1 is 250’ to water. The well is approximately 360 feet deep.

With all of the Brooke portion of Pine (about 90% of the homes) having been placed on Stage 5 yesterday and Stage 4 for several days before, it is apparent Brooke will continue heavy pumping. Your voluntary cooperation can help protect our well situation since we believe we pull out of the same upper aquifer as the rest of the Pine community, but fortunately as fissures and fractures we believe are somewhat above the points others draw from.
